Scholarships in Review

Recent years have seen some incredibly challenging times for everyone - particularly students - as their academic, personal and professional lives have all been interrupted. Although everyday life seems to have returned to "normal," the financial needs of students remains high and continues to increase.

In 2022, the US Zeta Psi Scholarship Committee received 430 applications. Nearly 200 awards were issued and we distributed over \$150,000 in grants. Awards were used to cover tuition, room and board, food, books and living expenses. Fall 2022 award recipients shared the impact these funds had on them: relieving the stress of financial burdens and the increasing cost of attendance, which gave the recipients the ability to purchase important books or subscriptions for class while shifting some time away from work. They were able to put this newfound time towards their academics.

The scholarship program would not be possible without the support of our donors, Foundation staff and volunteer graders: Evan Pressman, Alex Pruce, Alex Sharif, David Morris, Tom Leavens and Bob Baer. The team of graders successfully reviewed all applications within seven days, which enabled quick award determinations and ensuring that funds were distributed expeditiously.

Application numbers and their respective quality continue to increase while our ability to award grants remains relatively steady. To increase our support for students, the committee is working towards partnering with external organizations' community scholarship programs, sharing scholarship recipient spotlights with our donors and continuing to refine the emergency assistance program that was launched last year.
